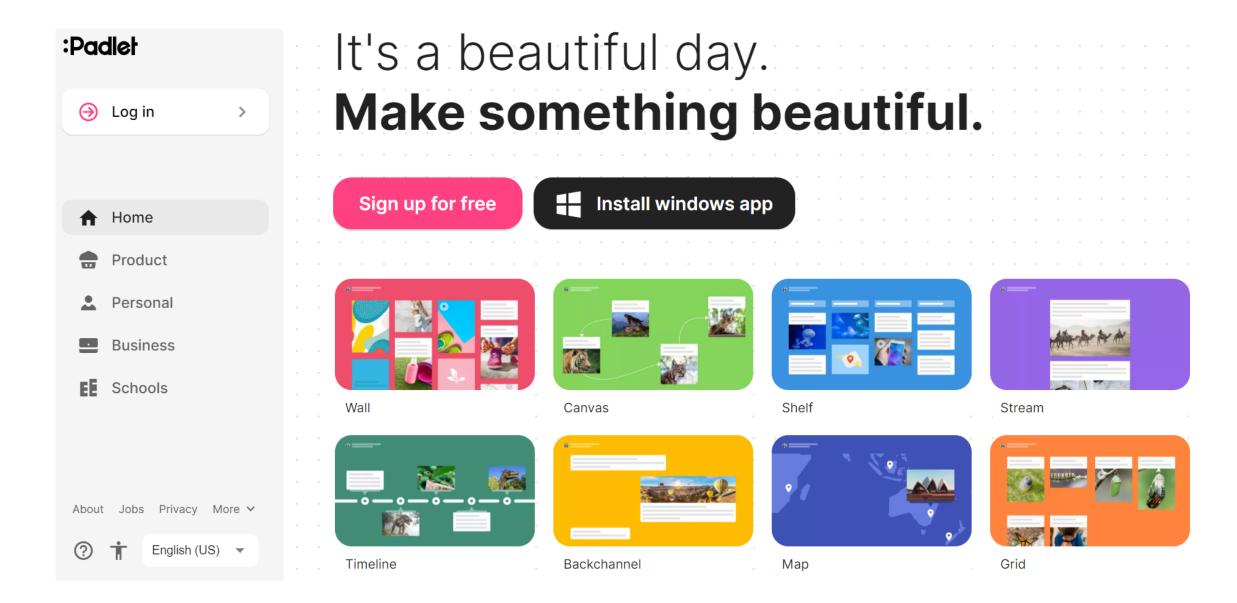

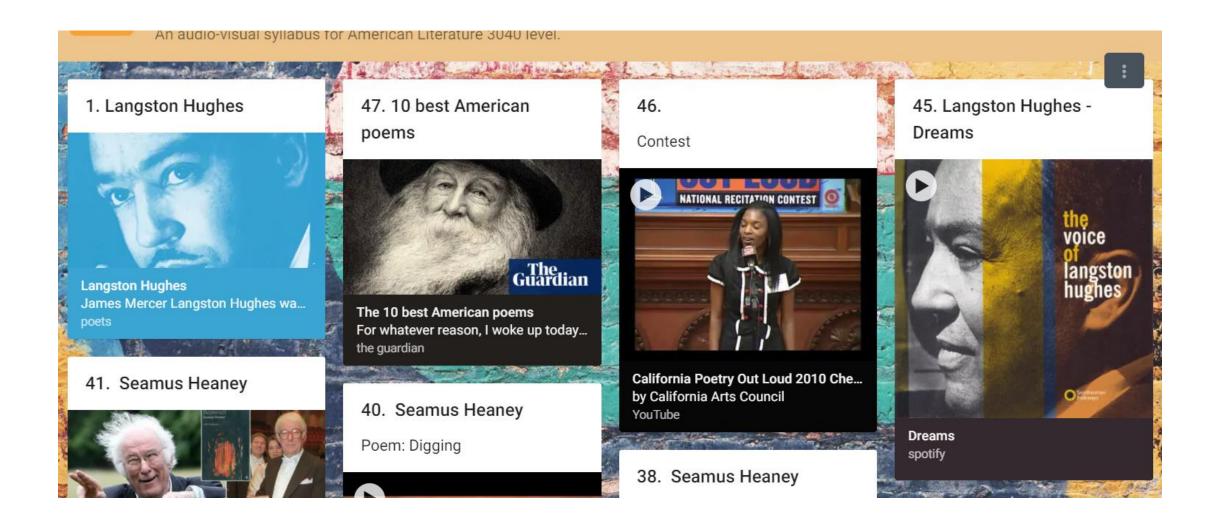

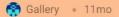

#### Memorial Days Around the World

In the USA, we honor those lost in battle on the last Monday of May. What about the rest of the world?

#### South Korea - Memorial Day (6 Jun)

Established to remember the Korean War, which began in 1950, and technically has never ended.

Cambodia - Victory over Genocide Day (7 Jan)

#### Australia, New Zealand -Anzac Day (25 Apr)

Jamaica - Heroes Day (Third Monday in Oct)

## Jamboard example – training exercise

Similar demographics in different parts of borough? Similar or different difficulties?

Asking those who are not coming why (how to find this out?) EG holding one off event in south of borough to try and get their details. Trying to find out from schools who the young carers are.

Check address profile of current people and see where they are currently from and pinpoint on a map

External data- any similar charities other places to find out where carers are - eg ask Social Services.

## What would Alice do next? Group 1

Is there a problem in the north that needs addressing

Difficult to get to carers - yp may not want school friends to know they are carers.

> Other carers groups available out of borough?

> > If they are young carers are they available? Busy caring?

Promoting to young carers who don't know about the work

> Information networks? What already exists?

Internal data: looking into the characteristics, how they found out about the service plus further questionnaire.

> Information on the service that goes out more to one part of the borough



Ask yp how they would reach people in another part of the

borough

Length of sessions whether this is a blockage.

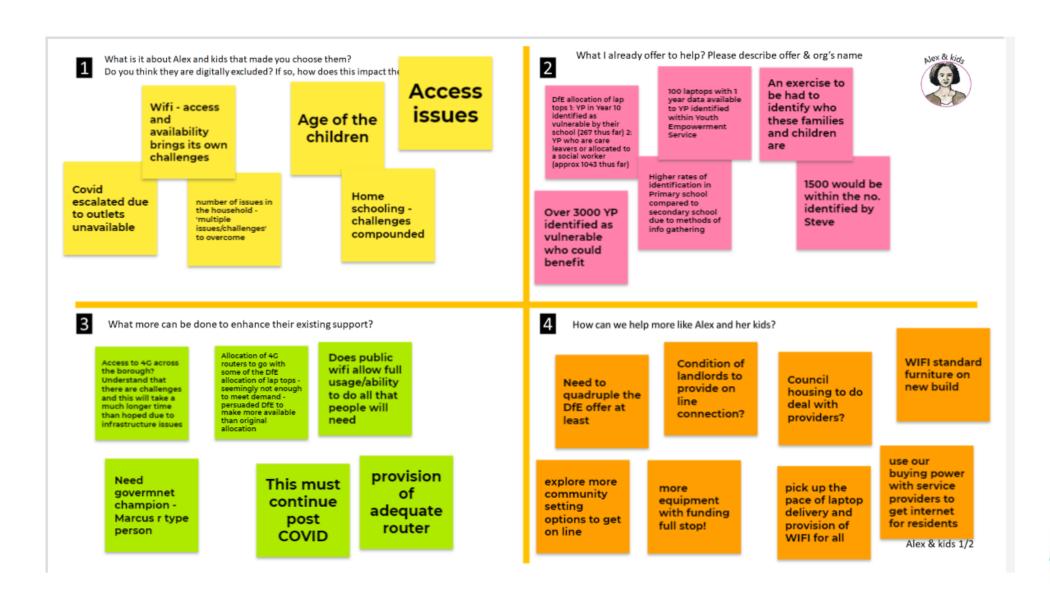
If they are a carer do they need to sort out their own transport and are they able to (eg too young to travel far) Bus at right time

Travel links around the area - to her venue How far from the centre do they live?

Age for travelling times? Safety?

Age of young people and whether they can travel Have they got help to get to the centre?

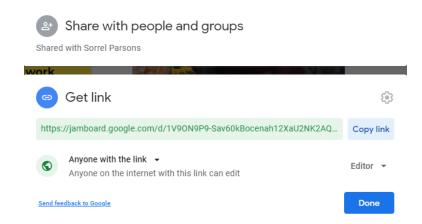

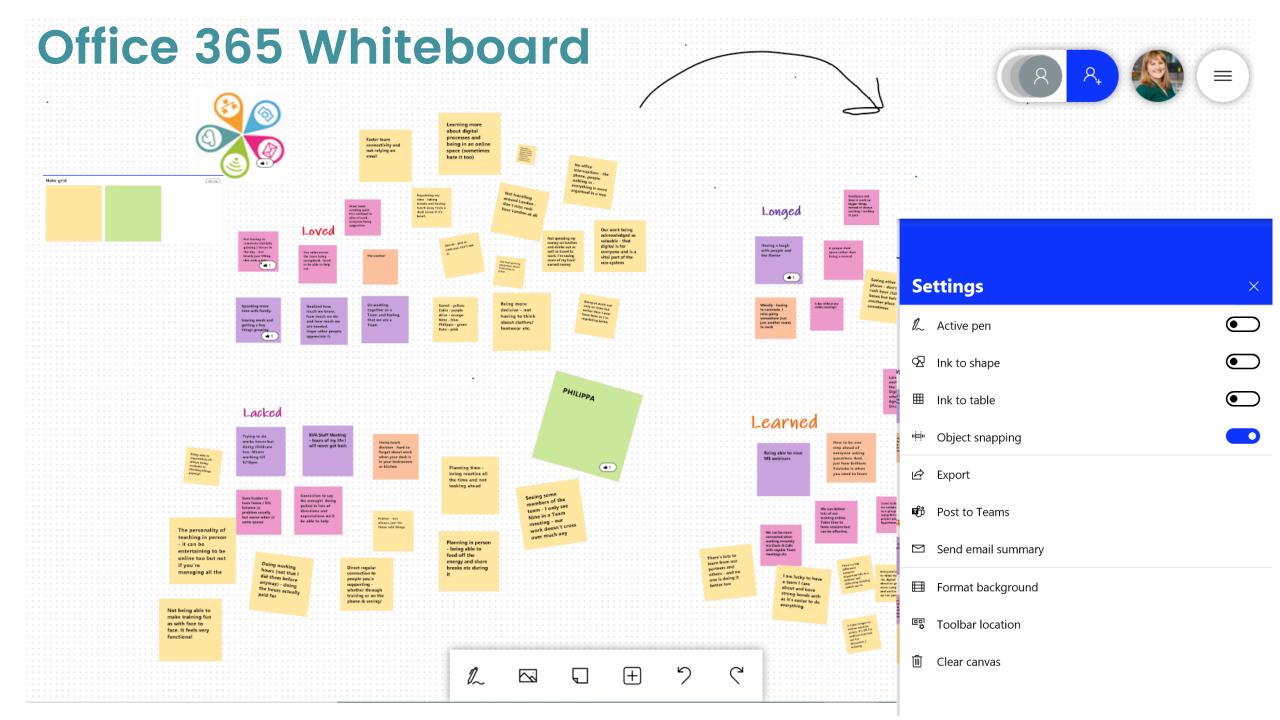


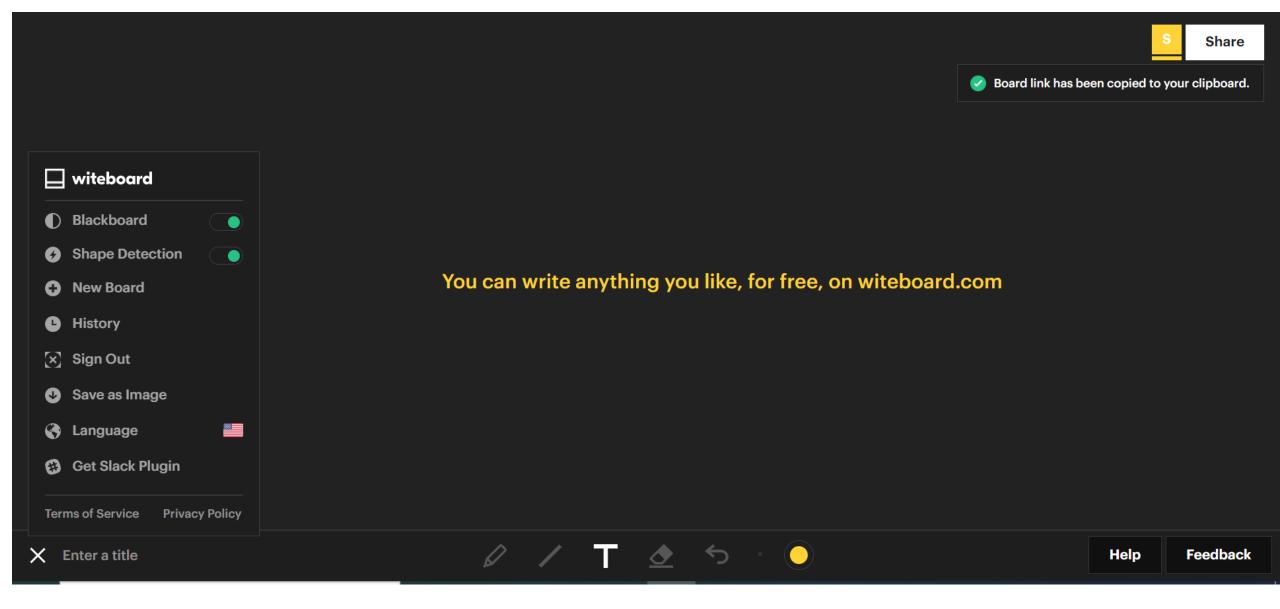


## Jamboard recap

- Jamboard is available to anyone with a Google account (whether personal or as part of an organisational Google Workspace account)
- ✓ Launch Jamboard from your app launcher grid (top left of screen)
- Set up your Jamboard and click on Share – make sure you switch to Anyone with the Link can access and that they can Edit not just View
- Download as a PDF or png image file
- Make a copy good if you are leaving open for further unsupervised contributions

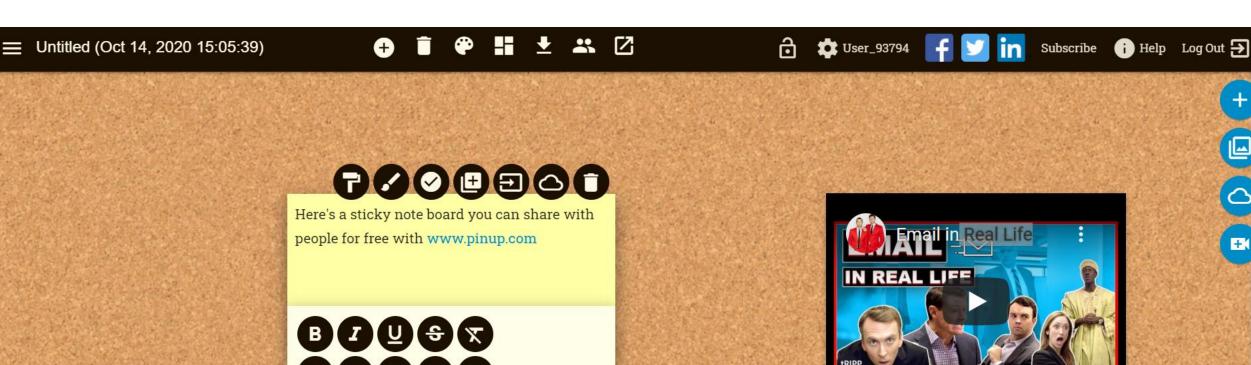

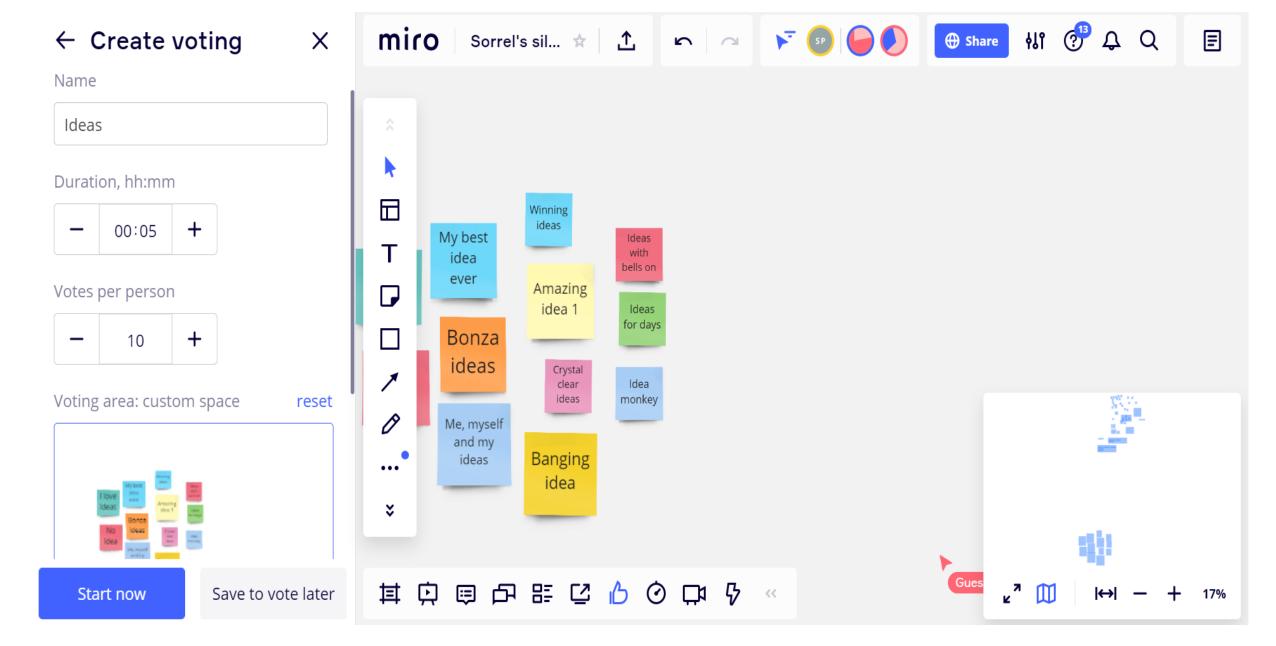

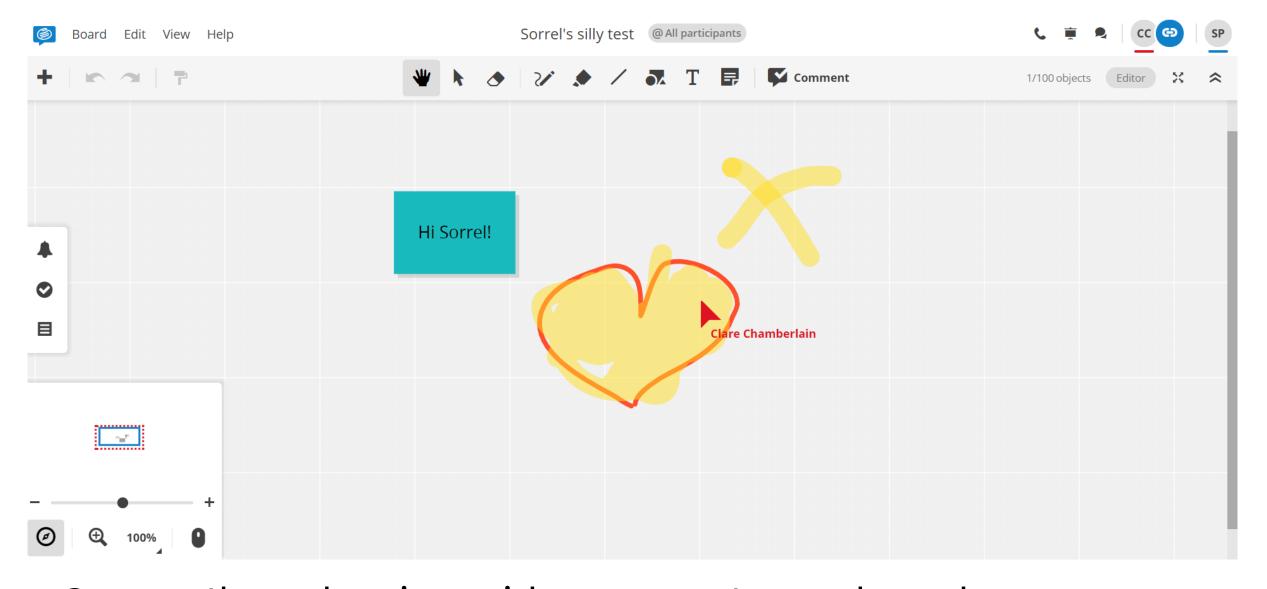
### Advanced collaboration boards

- ✓ Conceptboard free version 100 objects, 50 people can take part (then \$6)
- ✓ Miro free version includes 3 editable boards. Team plan starts at \$8 per member per month, minimum 2 members (30% non profit discount = circa £138 per year)
- ✓ Mural starts at \$12 per member per month

There are many others! But can get quite expensive per user.

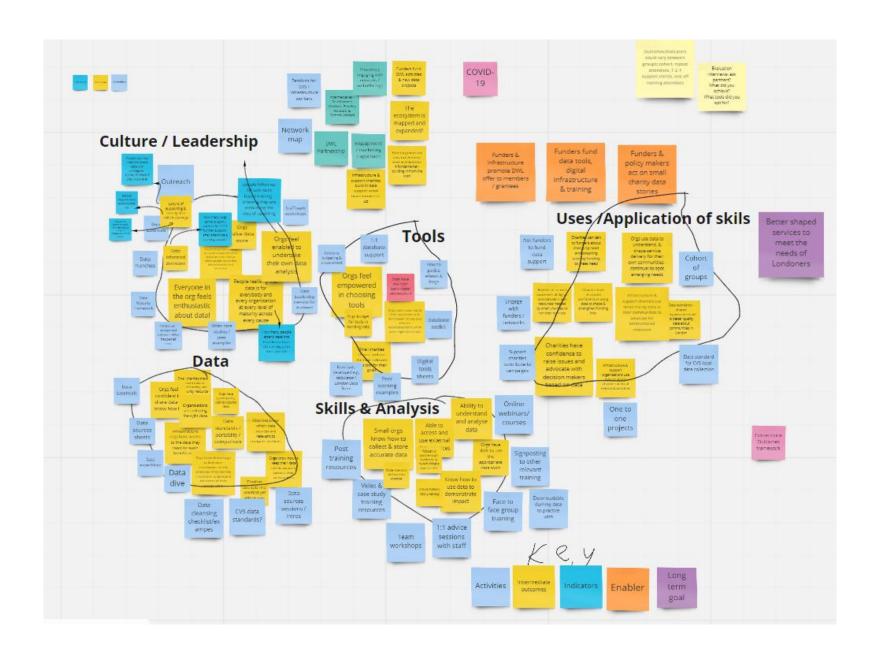

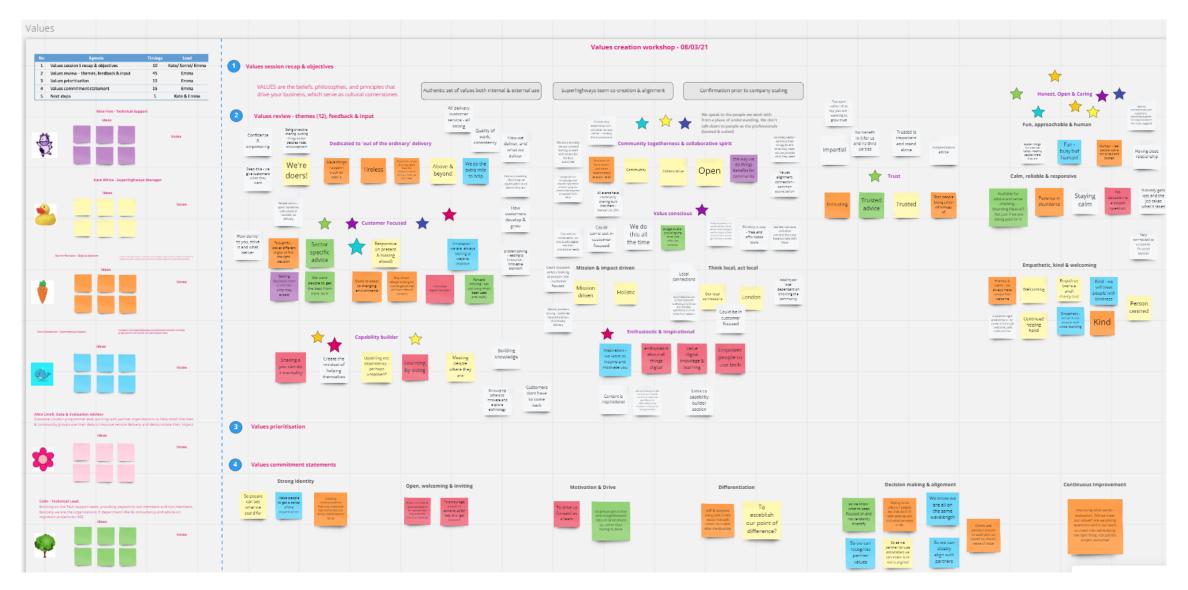


Conceptboard - nice midway, easy to use board - somewhere between Jamboard and a Miro board

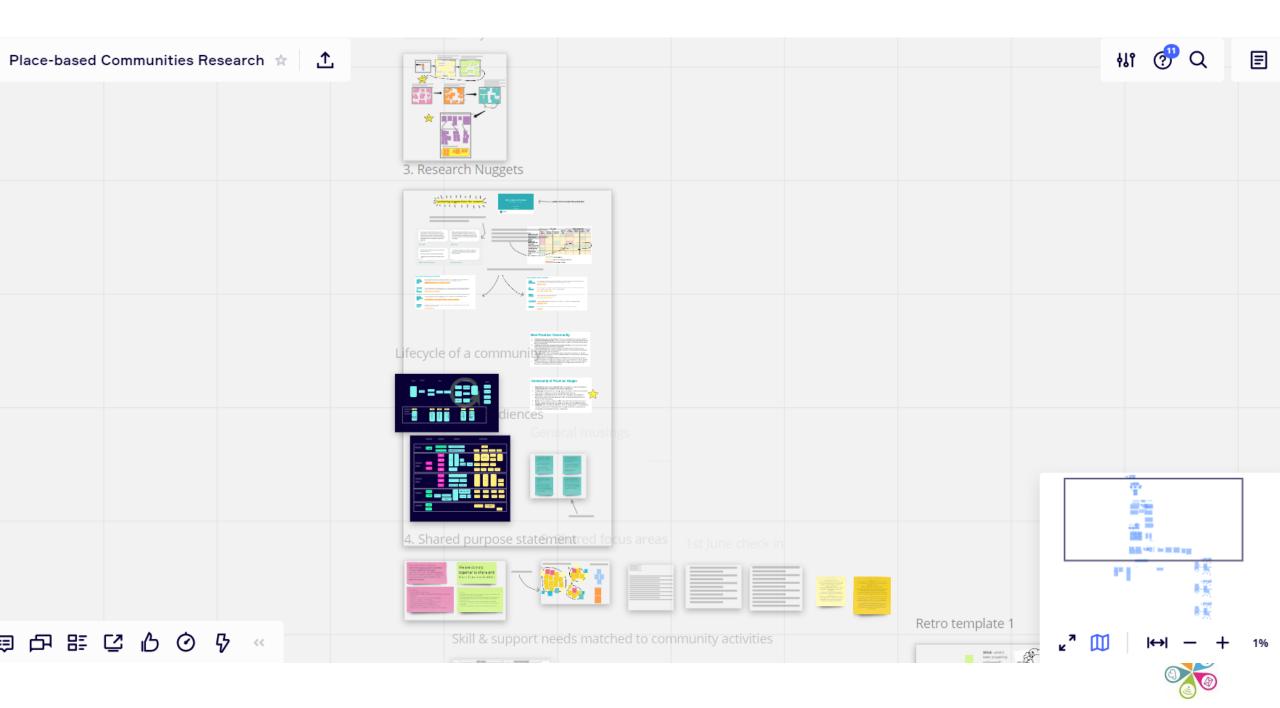












## Miro recap

- Large boards
- ✓ You'll need to show people how to navigate can be quite overwhelming for newbies!
- Voting capability
- Lots of templates e.g. flow charts, mind maps, customer journeys, kanban boards
- Download in multiple formats including Excel (potentially a real time saver)
- ✓ Make use of the 30% discount for charities!
- Paid version includes unlimited external editors

- ✓ Zoom support:
  - ✓ Sharing a Whiteboard
  - ✓ Using annotation tools on a shared screen or Whiteboard

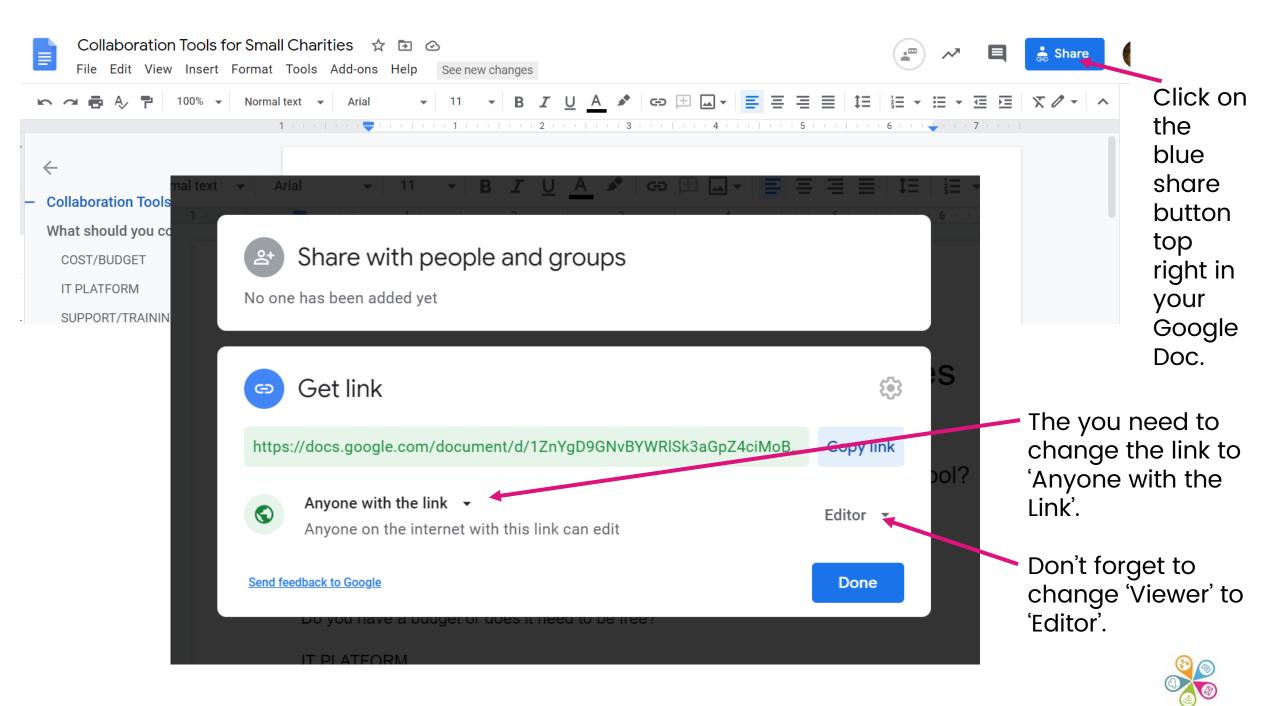




What should you look for before choosing a collaboration tool?

#### Crowdsourced - decision influencers

- Scalability
- ✓ Costs / charity discounts available
- ✓ Mobile vs desktop apps
- ✓ Organisational policy tools / platforms & methodologies
- ✓ Integration / automation possibilities
- Accessibility
- ✓ People / culture
- ✓ Internal / external use
- ✓ Support / training available
- Security / data governance



#### **Document collaboration**

- ✓ Google Docs works well online, easy to share
- ✓ Word share with One Drive, Teams or SharePoint
- ✓ Dropbox Paper, free product. Dropbox for Business starts at £10 per user, per month (40% discount possible)
- ✓ Zoho docs free for 5 users, 25 version history
- ✓ <u>Etherpad</u> free, open source (there are others)

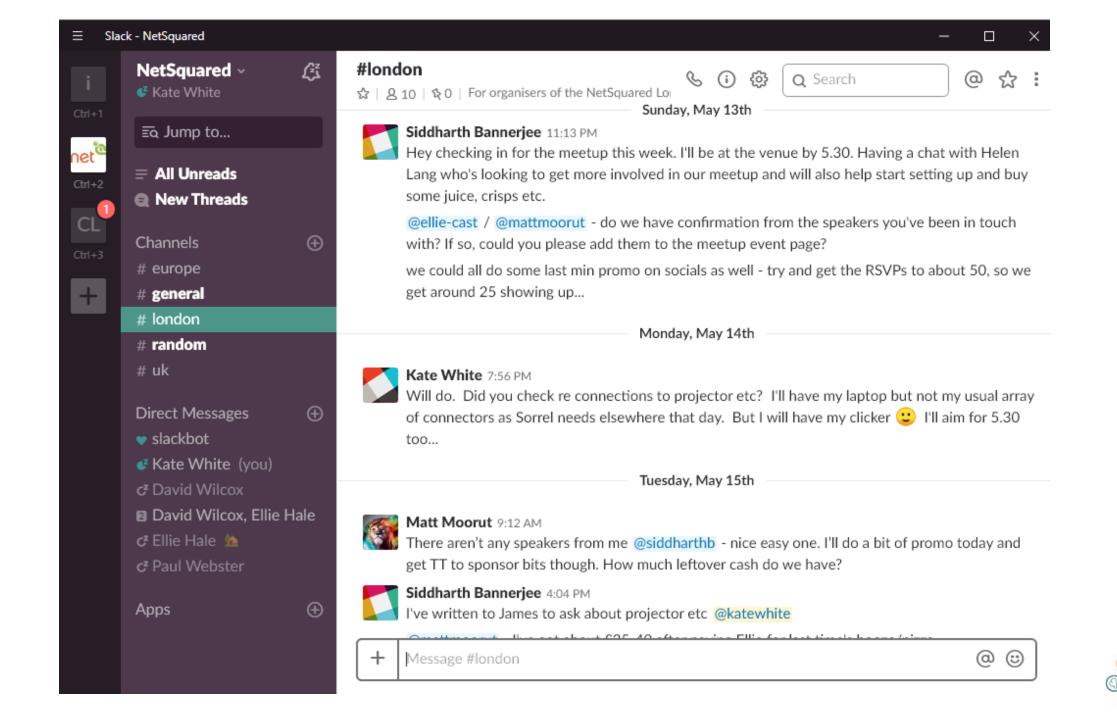


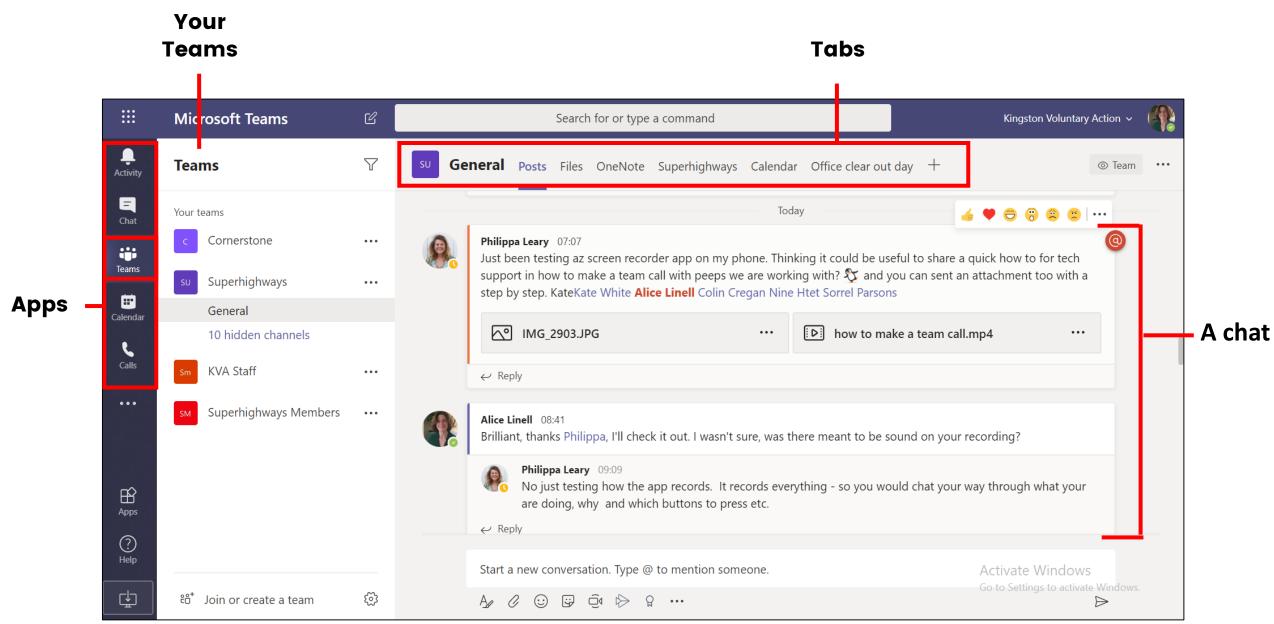
## Chat, messages and more

- ✓ Whatsapp free, business version, needs mobile
- ✓ Slack free (1:1 calls), £5.25 per user, pm
- <u>Element</u> (Matrix) open source software, currently glitch but worth keeping an eye on
- ✓ Google Chat need G-suite
- ✓ Microsoft Teams need Office 365
- ✓ Kaizala / Facebook Workplace suites big teams
