When the respondent can't read nor write

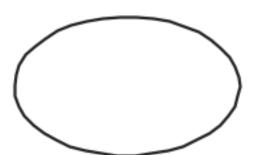
To gain insight into beneficiaries lives and experiences. Recording means we have proof of what was said

Audio means you capture how someone might talk about something.

To find out information and to listen to people's stories/opinions.

Are there reasons not to interview someone?

If the person doesn't give you permission

> lack of recording equipment

Duty of care

If you can't keep confidentiality for any reason

> If the environment is not a good one to record in - perhaps sound quality will be extremely poor for example

Embarrassing (spelling)

If you don't have right knowledge or skills to manage either the topic or their likely responses?
