In this blog series, we interview Hackney Wick residents about their lives under lockdown

Hi Sharon! What can you see from your balcony?

It's quite nice today. I can see for miles from my balcony. Victoria Park and over to Canary Wharf in one direction and just blocks of flats over the other side of Wick Road. All this is the Big Local area.

What does your day look like?

The days are different. We can't run the clubs and bingo that we used to run in Gascoyne Hall. That took up lots of my time. We had craft club on Monday, the community lunch on Wednesday and Bingo on Thursdays- I might see nearly a hundred people a week.

- ✓... is a scheduled activity
- ✓ Uses an interview guide
- ✓Interviewer is prepared and in control, but not controlling
- ✓ Max. 1 hour



Planning your questions

Looking for stories

What questions can we ask to capture people's stories? I'll spin to find an experience.

Questions for storytelling

- ✓ Plan questions to elicit strongest response
- ✓ Ask the same question get the right answer (forewarn them!)
- ✓Easy starter warm up?
- ✓ End for surprise/reflection



Follow up question techniques for insights

- ✓ Ask for an example
- ✓ Ask for meaning ("What does that mean?", "What does/did that mean to you?")
- ✓ Provide some evidence ("What makes you say that?")
- ✓ Ask for more detail ("Can you tell me more?")
- ✓ Reflect back to check understanding
- ✓ Verbal and non-verbal agreement (express interest)



Avoid in both cases

- ✓ Leading questions
- ✓ Double questions
- ✓ Loaded questions
- ✓ Ambiguous questions
- ✓ Jargon
- ✓Overly sensitive questions

HOW TO

RECORD AND TRANSCRIBE YOUR CONVERSATIONS




Pre-recording

- ✓...do you have consent?
- ✓ You have told people you are recording
- √It's stored safely
- ✓ Virtual consent forms, audio (video?) especially for publishing



What equipment will you need? Or already have?



Some helpful tools and techniques...

Lapel mic – plug into your phone (face-to-face)

Telephone pick up mic – insert into your ear and your recording device Use a mobile app e.g. Automatic Call Recorder (don't forget to switch it off)

Play it loud for dictate, Otter or speech notes to more easily pick up the sound




Transcribing

- ✓ Phone speech notes (might be hard virtually)
- ✓ AI transcription
- √Other free converters
- ✓DIY listening and typing
- ✓ What do you already have in your tool box? E.g. Captions on your videos






Auto transcribe – Office 365 dictate demo







Auto-transcribe with Microsoft Teams

- 2. You can access your recording and transcript in the calendar invite
- 3. And saves to either One Drive or SharePoint
