- Analysis of budgets and economic policy

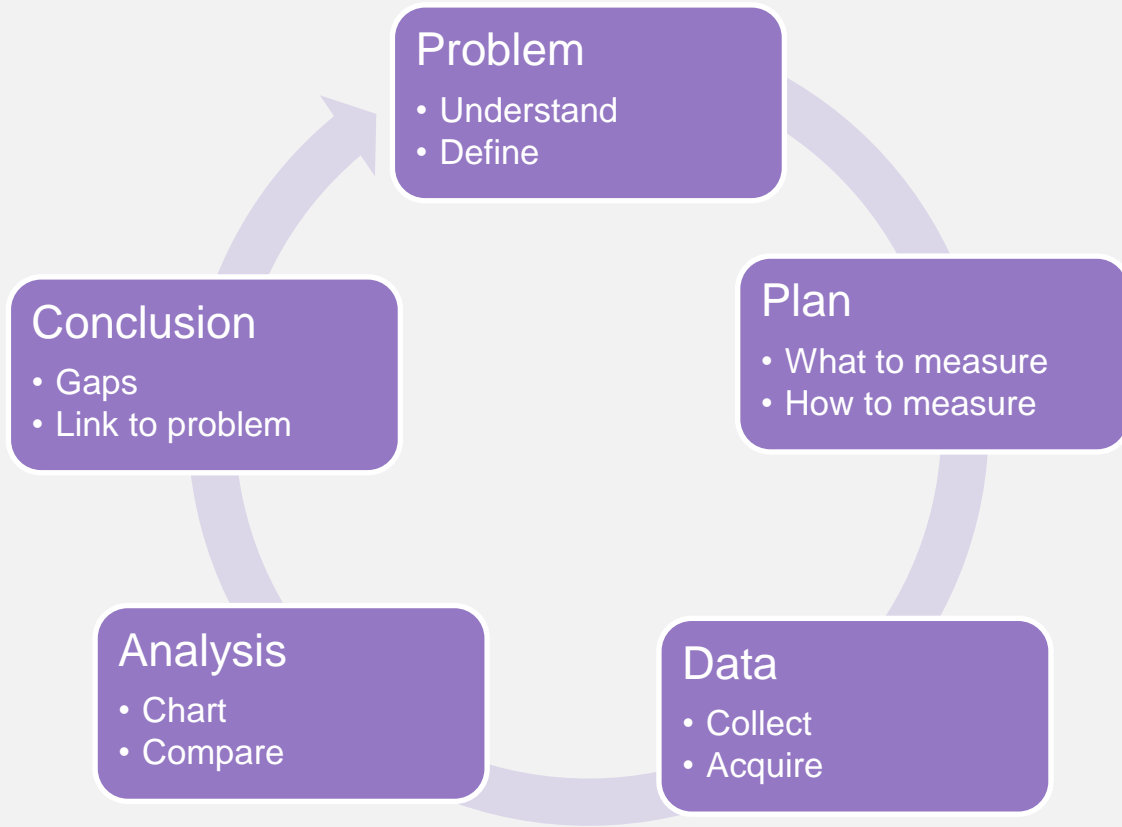
Local Data Project

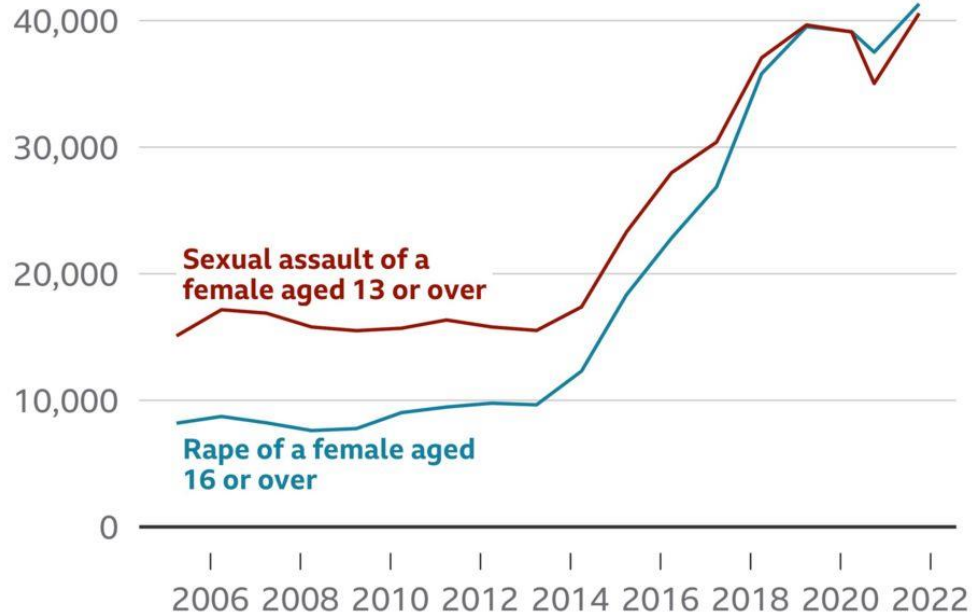
