Collecting data



Create free surveys online in minutes with Google Forms. View results graphically in real time




With Microsoft Office 365 forms you can easily create quizzes & surveys and see the results as they come in.



Create a QuickTap survey online and collect offline responses using a tablet. Starts at \$41/month for one device. JotForm offers a limited free service.



Typeform has a nice interface, offering a free plan with 10 questions but only 10 responses a month. £21 per month thereafter! 50% charity discount available.



Mentimeter is our favourite interactive data collection software. Great for large and small events, sharing results to social media and more.



Impactasaurus is free for tracking your impact with peer-reviewed questionnaires, individual or group tracking and easy reporting and visualisations.



Send texts to multiple people via online SMS bulk sender TextLocal to gather responses to questions. Charity discount available.

Mapping data



Use Batchgeo to create maps by copying and pasting postcodes from Excel. Add other data and map pins will be colour coded accordingly.



Add postcode data to Google MyMaps, including up to 10 layers of information as pins or icons, including shape files e.g. Borough / Ward outlines.



Input a postcode, and MapIt returns the constituency, council area & ward and more. You can also download area shape files.



Paste your postcodes into the box and automatically map your data to the Indices of Deprivation with Community Lens. Free to use.

Audio



audioBoom lets you record, collate and share audio online. \$9.99 per month



SoundCloud allows private storage and sharing as well as public posts. Publish up to 3 free hours of recordings.



Audacity desktop software is free to download and allows you to edit your audio.



Convert your audio to text or record straight into Otter.ai app or online. 300 minutes per month free transcription.

Use Datawrapper to create stunning charts by pasting your data. You can also create London maps.

Readymag helps you create webpages and other designs. 10 pages per project for free.




Create attractive free shareable boards and maps with multi-media content with Padlet for data collection or publishing.
