Databank



What is the National Databank?

- The aim is to work with community partners to provide **free access to the internet** to those who are unable to get online
- The National Databank website has been co-designed by Good Things Foundation and The Lab
 © O2
- Good Things Foundation have taken on running and management of the National Databank from **January 2022 December 2023**
- Virgin Media O2 and Vodafone have donated 46m gigabytes of data, and Three now joining too. Aim is to support over 500,000 people
- The website and processes will be **continuously developed** and improved over the next year
- We are hoping that **other Telecoms companies** come on board and we'll be able to provide from multiple networks



Who can receive free data vouchers?

Someone receiving data through the National Databank must:

- Be 18+ years old
- AND be from a low income household

And qualifies in one or several of the following statements:



- Has no access or insufficient access to the internet at home
- AND/OR has no or insufficient access to the internet when away from the home
- **AND/OR** cannot afford their existing monthly contract or top up

Data available

O2 data

- O2 pay as you go SIM cards provided (to be used with data vouchers)
- Data vouchers each provide **7GB, free calls and texts** for 30 days from activation
- Vouchers can be issued for **1 6 months**

Vodafone data

- SIM cards arrive preloaded with data
- 20GB, free calls and texts for 30 days, refreshes automatically for
 6 months
